### Who are we?

Tipu Ora PTE is a Private Training Establishment within Manaaki Ora Trust. We offer New Zealand Certificate and Diploma level courses in Whānau Ora across Aotearoa.

Our courses prepare kaimahi working with whānau in the community, (not only Whānau Ora Navigators, but all those working with whānau), with the best possible skills and knowledge to support whānau to achieve their aspirations.

Our courses are delivered in a wānanga setting, with assessments being completed online. Pūkenga Mātauranga, who are highly qualified and respected in their field of expertise, present relevant, engaging information alongside passionate kaiako. Taura will be assessed with NZQA unit standards and modules using a variety of assessment methods.

### Course Fees

Employees of Te Whatu Ora funded organisations may be eligible for a training grant for which the individual must make application directly through their local Te Whatu Ora. ## Te Pōkaitahi Whānau Ora (Kaupae 4) New Zealand Certificate in Whānau Ora (Level 4)

### Programme overview

The NZ Certificate in Whānau Ora is delivered in six 3-day wānanga (Wed-Fri) over 6 months focusing on the following kaupapa:

1. Whanau
2. Tika
3. Manaakitanga
4. Whakapono / Tikanga
5. Kaitiakitanga
6. Mātauranga / Aroha

The NZQA qualification consists of 60 credits and provides tauira with an understanding of how to support whānau effectively whilst looking through the lens of a Māori worldview. Tauira will learn about Te Tiriti o Waitangi, whānau diversity, Māori models of health, the human life cycle and traditional practices and Māori methods of communication. Throughout the programme you will be required to use Google Classroom to complete activities and assessments from home.

### Graduate Outcomes

On successful completion of the course graduates will:

- ♦ display self-awareness, reflective practice and personal leadership in a whanau ora setting
- ♦ engage and communicate effectively, using a range of strategies, when delivering services to whānau, hapu, iwi and hāpori
- ♦ contribute to a culture of quality, safety and professionalism in a whanau ora setting, that lead to improved outcomes for whanau
- ♦ work collaboratively with whanau to design a whanau plan, record observations and assessments, and evaluate success.

### Enrolment & Course Criteria

- ♦ Min of 18 years of age and NZ citizen (or citizen of Australia, Tokelau, Niue, Cook Islands) or permanent resident;
- ♦ Access to the internet and a device (computer or tablet);
- ♦ Basic computer skills as you will be required to access Google Classroom (prior knowledge of Google Classroom is not required).

## Te Pōkairua Whānau Ora (Kaupae 5) New Zealand Diploma in Whānau Ora (Level 5)

### Programme overview

The NZ Diploma in Whānau Ora is delivered in ten 3-day wānanga (Wed-Fri) over 10 months focusing on the following kaupapa:

1. Whānau
2. Tikanga
3. Mātauranga
4. Aroha
5. Whānau / Mātauranga
6. Katiakitanga
7. Tika / Aroha
8. Whakapono / Manaakitanga
9. Mātauranga / Manaakitanga
10. Mātauranga / Aroha

The NZ Diploma in Whānau Ora consists of 120 credits and is an extension of the NZ Certificate in Whānau Ora. Through the lens of a Māori world view tauira will explore tikanga and kawa of the marae, pūrākau, ko au, whāngai, whakamā, wairua and the future of Whānau Ora. Throughout the programme you will be required to use Google Classroom to complete activities and assessments from home.

### Graduate Outcomes

On successful completion of the course graduates will:

- ◆ understand both the political landscape of Whānau Ora and the traditional and practical applications for whānau, hapu and iwi
- ◆ have developed research and evaluation skills
- ◆ understand and apply analytical and critical thinking into establishment and review of whānau centred service delivery
- ◆ know how to implement and evaluate a Whānau Ora plan.
- ◆ understand whānau diversity and whānau dynamics and the impacts on developing a whānau plan.
- ◆ be able to formulate their own definitions of ora and hauora and understand the impacts.
- ◆ be able to apply constructive feedback as a means of improvement, for self and whānau.
- ◆ have excellent communication and presentation skills.

### Enrolment & Course Criteria

- ◆ NZ Certificate in Whānau Ora Level 4 or National Certificate in Hauora Māori Level 4 and pre-entry assessment if required;
- ◆ Access to the internet and a device (computer or tablet);
- ◆ Basic computer skills as you will be required to access Google Classroom
